

CIRCULAR NO. 124

SUBJECT :- Finding regarding the objects of the trusts.

It is observed that the trustees of certain public trusts while making application for registration under the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950, describe the objects of the trust in vague terms and consequently the Regional Officers give their findings according to the information given in the application. For example the object of the trust is mentioned as "Religious and Charitable". This does not specify the particulars of religious or charitable objects. Since the "objects of the trust" is a very important item of application for registration it is impressed upon the Regional Officers to see that the trustees give the information in the application for registration in this behalf in a very clear and distinct manner.

In case the Deputy/Assistant Charity Commissioner, after having recorded their findings, finds that the objects mentioned by the trustees in their application are described vaguely he may start suo motu inquiry under Section 22-A of the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950, for particulars specifying distinctly as to what the objects are.
