

## CIRCULAR NO. 136

**SUBJECT :- Remanded cases - Speedy disposal of**

It has been observed by the Charity Commissioner during the course of the inspection of the Public Trusts Registration Offices under the Charity Organization, that the cases remanded by the Charity Commissioner or the Courts are shown to have been instituted on the dates on which the Record and Proceedings are received in their Offices and are entered in the Balance Sheet accordingly.

This practice of showing remanded cases is irregular. The cases, though remanded subsequently after a considerable period, should be shown in the balance sheet in the year in which they were first instituted and not in the year in which they were subsequently remanded, i.e. the inquiry of 1952 remanded in 1969 should be mentioned in the balance sheet as on inquiry of 1952 and not of 1969, and while showing this case in the balance sheet as on 1952 a remark about the date of remand in the bracket against the case should be mentioned invariably. The balance sheets of pending cases should now be revised accordingly in the light of these instructions.

It is further instructed that priority should be given to these remanded cases for disposal. As soon as the case is remanded, the same should be fixed on the board immediately on the first available occasion and every effort should be made to see that the same is

disposed of expeditiously, so that old matters will be reduced from the list of pending cases.
