

## **CIRCULAR NO. 19**

**SUBJECT.— Official language. English translation of Documents, etc.**

In the Government Circular, Political and Services Department, No. 2026/46, dated the 28<sup>th</sup> November 1951, Government was pleased to direct that the English language should continue to be used by all offices even at the district level in matters such as medical, medico legal, judicial, quasi-judicial, accounts, technical reports, treasury accounts, etc.

These directions however, do not mean that parties can be compelled to furnish English translations of documents produced or applications made by them. Under the existing Government orders, a request for such transactions would be permissible, but if the parties show unwillingness to comply with it the matter cannot be further pressed. All letters asking for English translations of any documents should be worded in the form of a request.
