

CIRCULAR No. 205

SUBJECT- Disposal of inquiries by the Inspectors of the Regional Officer and Sub-Regional Offices.

While scrutinizing the returns submitted by the Regional Offices in respect of disposal of enquiries by the Inspectors, it is noticed that many cases are pending for more than 6 months. The delay at Inspectors level causes unhappy state of affair for all purposes and creates difficulties to this office to satisfy the parties directly approaching this office or to submit reports to Government or Lokayukta in the time limit prescribed. It is reasonably expected that inquiry must be completed within a month from the date of receipt by the Inspector and the Regional Officers should adhere to these orders hereafter. In case, if it is noticed that the inquiry is delayed beyond one month and the Regional Officer has to scrutinize. The same and see that delay was reasonable and that in any case it is not beyond six months. If any inspector is found not following the orders or delaying the case without reasonable cause such cases should be reported to the Charity Commissioner for appropriate action. If the Regional Officer does not certify his satisfaction for the delay such cases should also be brought to the notice of Charity Commissioner by the Office.

All the Inspectors working in the Organization should take a note of above orders and follow them scrupulously. The monthly return submitted to this office here after should contain the factual date of cases reported pending beyond one month.
